## Successful Emergency Communication Exercise

Radio Emergency Services (ARES), LeeCARES, held a successful emergency communication exercise in Lee County.

This exercise focused setup. on mapping direct communications via amateur radio in Lee County and deployment, setup and use portable radios and antennas. LeeCARES members were able to successfully communicate, directly or via relays, without a repeater, in an area spanning from Caldwell to Smithville, and Georgetown and Jonah, from Bartlett to South Austin.

LeeCARES members increased their knowledge of the portable radios and were able to successfully resolve issues. This exercise boosted enthusiasm and confidence to be able to communicate throughout the Lee County and beyond in case the regular means of communications fails during an emergency or disaster.

Our members became aware that portable radio antennas need to be raised higher above the ground, for better communications. As a one of our members has developed a prototype that was operational by the next day. Improvements are being made to ease the antenna
